The History Major-Social Studies Concentration is an interdisciplinary program designed specifically for students pursuing teacher certification in social studies Grades 4-12. Certification to teach also requires completion of a series of Wisconsin Teacher Certification (DPI) requirements. The History Major-Social Studies Concentration is a comprehensive major that fulfills both the major and minor requirements for graduation.
