The History Major-Social Studies Concentration is an interdisciplinary program designed specifically for students pursuing teacher certification in social studies Grades 4-12. Certification to teach also requires completion of a series of Wisconsin Teacher Certification (DPI) requirements. The History Major-Social Studies Concentration is a comprehensive major that fulfills both the major and minor requirements for graduation. Students majoring in the History Major-Social Studies Concentration are urged to work in close cooperation with their academic advisors to ensure efficient completion of the program.

Student Learning Outcomes

1. Students will be trained as "entry-level" social scientists who are knowledgeable about the concepts, facts, tools, forms of disciplinary inquiry, and disciplinary forms of representation in civics, economic, geography, history, and the social/behavioral sciences.
2. Students will achieve disciplinary mastery in History as described in the History Major student learning outcomes.
3. Students will engage in ethical reasoning to deliberate social, political, and economic issues.
4. Students will apply their content knowledge to plan social studies learning sequences for grades 4-12 learners.
